

## **Workshop : Freeze Frame**

### **National Curriculum Links**

#### KS1:

- Opportunities for children to practice speaking clearly and convey ideas confidently using Standard English.
- Opportunity for children to articulate and justify answers, arguments and opinions.

- Mutual respect and tolerance: Learning about the Romans encourages students to be tolerant and respectful of others' culture, beliefs and faith.
- Children are encouraged to think about democracy, individual liberty and tolerance.

Learning objectives	Session structure	Assessment for learning
<p><b>To learn about Arbeia Roman Fort and surrounding area.</b></p> <p><b>To learn about how people lived during the Roman times in Britain.</b></p> <p><b>To learn about the artefacts in the museum collection and what this tells us about the people who lived at Arbeia and the surrounding area.</b></p> <p><b>To learn about other cultures and belief systems.</b></p>	<p><b>Introduction</b></p> <p>It is explained that Children will take part in a carousel of 3 activities to explore the museum collection of art, pottery, jewellery, weaponry, carvings, etc. and to be inspired to then create a drawing of an object they are interested in. All drawings are then put onto a large piece of paper to be taken back to school.</p> <p><b>Session activities</b></p> <p>The first activity is a handling session using the “I see, notice, and wonder” model to practice observation skills</p>	<p>Children will explore themes through object handling and information gathering, we will ask questions throughout to check understanding.</p> <p>Children will have opportunities to respond and give feedback throughout the session.</p>

<p><b>To produce a work of art based on an object in the collection.</b></p> <p><b>To express opinions</b></p> <p><b>To be creative.</b></p>	<p>and to understand how an object can inform about the past.</p> <p>Next the children are given an object quiz and must explore the collections in order to find the answers. In addition this gives the children the opportunity to explore and find an object they would like to know more about and then create an artwork.</p> <p>The final activity is to study and draw the object of choice using coloured pastels.</p> <p><b>Plenary</b></p> <p>Children will have an opportunity to answer the quiz questions at the end of the session in a final group activity.</p> <p>Children will share what they chose to draw, and why.</p>	<p>There will be opportunities for Q&amp;A at the end of the session.</p>
